

Lt. Col. Marcus Haring, a native of Montville, Conn., graduated from Virginia Military Institute in 1993 with a Bachelor's Degree in Civil Engineering. Upon commissioning into the Transportation Corps, he attended and graduated from the Transportation Officer Basic Course at Fort Eustis and served on active duty for 9 years.
