

CPT Jermaine Denny graduated with a bachelor of science degree from the University of Louisville in December 2006. He receiving his commission as an Adjutant General Corp officer in December of 2006 and attended the Adjutant General Basic Officer Leadership Course Phase 2 in Fort Benning, Ga. Following BOLC Phase 2, he attended and completed BOLC 3 in Fort Jackson, S.C. His first assignment was with the G1, 100th Training Division in Louisville, Ky. He mobilized as a post deployment health reassessment coordinator for the 100th Division from October 2007 to October 2008. The program was reorganized a year later and he became a PDHRA coordinator for the 88th Regional Support Command from 2008 to 2009. From 2009 to 2011 he was the Lead PDHRA coordinator/program manager for the Army Reserve PDHRA program working directly for the Office of the Chief, Army Reserve (OCAR), surgeon's office. Denny accepted a position in the Active Guard Reserve program in September of 2011.
