

LTC Walter Roberson began his military career upon entering the United States Military Academy in 1991. Upon completion of his studies in June 1995, he received a commission as a second lieutenant in the infantry.

Roberson earned a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering from USMA in West Point, N.Y. and a Masters in Military Arts and Science from the Command and General Staff College in Leavenworth, Kan. Roberson is also a graduate of the Infantry Officers Basic Course, the Infantry Officers Captains Career Course, and the Combined Arms Services Staff School, and the Command and General Staff Course.

Upon completion of the Infantry Officer Basic Course, Roberson was assigned to the 1st Cavalry Division in 2nd Battalion, 5th Cavalry in Fort Hood, Texas, where he served as a rifle platoon leader, rifle company executive officer, and scout platoon leader. During his assignment he deployed in support of Operation Noble Eagle to Bosnia-Herzegovina. His next assignment was to the 25th Infantry Division in 3rd Brigade and 2nd Battalion, 5th Infantry, Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, where he served as brigade assistant S3, battalion assistant S3, and rifle company commanding officer. Roberson's next assignment was to the 6th Ranger Training Battalion at Eglin air force base, Fla., where he served as HHC commanding officer. During this assignment Roberson deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom as a MiTT executive officer. After completion of CGSC, Roberson was assigned to the 82nd Airborne Division as brigade assistant operations officer and squadron operations officer. During this assignment Roberson deployed in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. Upon completion of this assignment, he was assigned to Fort Benning, Ga., where he served as the infantry branch representative and executive officer for 2nd Battalion, 29th Infantry. During this assignment Roberson deployed in support of Operation Enduring Freedom where he served as a deputy team leader on the COMISAF advisory and assistance team. Roberson redeployed from OEF in May 2012.
