

LTC Christopher T. Kuhn

LTC Chris Kuhn, from Middletown, Pa., was commissioned a 2 LT in the Corps of Engineers from the United States Military Academy in June, 1995. He attended the Engineer Officer Basic Course, at Fort Leonard Wood, Mo. in July, 1995 and upon graduation, was assigned to the 299th Engineer Battalion, 4th Infantry Division, at Fort Hood, Texas. While at Fort Hood, he served in several positions to include sapper platoon leader, assault & obstacle platoon leader, battalion assistant S3, and company executive officer.

Upon completion of the Engineer Captain's Career Course in December 1999, Kuhn was assigned to the 44th Engineer Battalion, 2nd Infantry Division in the Republic Of Korea. There, he served as battalion assistant S3 and company commander of HHC, 44th Engineer Battalion.

In 2001, Kuhn was assigned to the 1st Battalion, 394th Infantry Regiment (Training Support) at Plaquemine, La. where he served as an Observer, Controller/Trainer (OC/T) for the 1088th Engineer Battalion, Louisiana National Guard.

In 2003, Kuhn was assigned to the National Training Center at Fort Irwin, Calif. where he served as an Observer/Controller on the Sidewinder Team and chief of live fire range operations, Phoenix Team.

Upon completion of the Command and General Staff College in 2006, Kuhn was assigned as a battalion military transition team chief and deployed to Taji, Iraq, where he advised an Iraqi Army Mechanized Infantry battalion in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom.

In May 2008, Kuhn was assigned to Fort Lewis, Wash., and served as the brigade engineer for 5/2 Stryker Brigade Combat Team. In March of 2009, Kuhn was dual assigned as the 5/2 Brigade Special Troops Battalion (BSTB) S3 and Brigade Engineer for the brigade's deployment to Kandahar, Helmand, and Zabul Provinces in Afghanistan from July, 2009 to July, 2010. Upon redeployment in July, 2010, Kuhn took command of the BSTB until its deactivation in December, 2010.

In 2011, Kuhn was again assigned to the National Training Center, Fort Irwin, Calif. where he served as the battalion operations officer OC/T on the Sidewinder Team.
