

LTC Michael A. Magliocco was commissioned as a signal officer in 1994 upon graduation from Virginia Military Institute. Following the Signal Officer Basic Course, he was assigned to the 67th Signal Battalion, where he served in various leadership and staff positions, including cable and area note platoon leader, executive officer, and battalion telecommunication/ training officer. In 1998, he served a six month tour as the signal officer, 650th MI Group, Allied Command Europe – Counter Intelligence, Supreme Headquarters, Allied Powers Europe.

In 1999, he left active duty and continued his service in the Army Reserve. He was assigned to A Co, 404th Civil Affairs Battalion, serving as a civil affairs team leader and battalion automation officer. In 2000, he attended the Civil Affairs Officer Advance Course. In 2001, he mobilized and deployed as the unit S4 and G3 humanitarian assistance officer, Task Force Falcon, Kosovo for 6 months.

In early 2003, he deployed with B Co, 404th Civil Affairs Battalion as a civil affairs team leader in support of Joint Special Operations Task Force-North. His team was responsible for support to civil administration immediately following the invasion, assisting with the re-establishment of electricity and transportation services in the city of Kirkuk for one year.

Upon redeployment in 2004, he assumed command of B Company, 404th Civil Affairs Battalion. In 2006, he was assigned as the S3, 404th Civil Affairs Battalion, where he oversaw the unit's conversion to an airborne battalion. In 2008, he was assigned as the executive officer of the 404th Civil Affairs Battalion.

In 2008, upon completion of his assignment with the 404th, he transferred to the 2nd Mission Command Training Brigade, 75th Mission Command Training Division serving as the chief of training for the brigade. In 2011, he was selected to participate in the Human Terrain System Program as a team leader. He deployed to Afghanistan in January 2012 and served as a team leader in support of Regimental Combat Team 5, 1st Marine Division Forward in Helmand Province.

Magliocco's military schools include the Signal Officer Basic Course; Civil Affairs Officer Advance Course; Combined Arms Exercise; Intermediate Level Education - Common Core; Intermediate Level Education - Advanced Operations and Warfighter Course; Defense Strategy Course; and Foreign Security Forces - Combat Advisor's Course.
