

LTC Calvin E. Fish enlisted in the Army Reserve in 1985. He attended Basic Training at Fort Knox, Ky. and Advance Individual Training at Fort Leonard Wood Mo., graduating the 63B Light-Wheeled-Vehicle-Mechanics Course as the distinguished honor graduate. In 1990 he was commissioned from Pittsburg State University, Pittsburg Kan., as a distinguished military graduate and started his career as an officer. He served in a variety of positions to include mortar platoon leader and a rifle platoon leader for 1st Battalion 506th Infantry Regiment, training and executive officer for basic combat training.

In 1996 he entered the Individual Ready Reserve and worked for Saudi Strategic Services (S3) out of Tabuk, Saudi Arabia Reentering Troop Program Unit status in 1998 assigned as a mobilization analyst and later as the detachment commander USAR Readiness Command.
