

Lt. Col. Nicholas A. Joslin

Lt. Col. Joslin graduated from Oklahoma State University, with a bachelor's degree in Geology, and was commissioned into the Field Artillery branch. After graduating from the Field Artillery Officer Basic Course, he served as a MLRS Platoon Leader, Battery Executive Officer and Battalion S2 in the 6th Battalion, 27th Field Artillery Regiment at Fort Sill, Okla.

Upon completion from the Field Artillery Officer Advanced Course, he was assigned to 10th Division Artillery at Fort Drum, N.Y., where he served as a Division Targeting Officer. He later moved to 3rd Battalion 6th Field Artillery, where he served as Battalion S2, Battalion Fire Support Officer for 1-32 IN, and as Commander of Alpha Battery.

Joslin was then assigned to Fort Leavenworth where he served as a Team Chief for Current Forces Integration Directorate; he later attended the Command and Staff College. He then moved to Fort Lewis, Wash., where he served as an Assistant Fire Support Coordinator and Deputy Chief of G3 Training for I Corps. He was then assigned to the 5th Brigade 2nd Infantry Division where he served as the S3 for 3rd Battalion 17th Field Artillery and afterward as the Brigade Fire Support Officer.

Deployments include operational deployments to Bosnia and Kosovo, as well as two combat tours to Afghanistan. Major Joslin is currently assigned as the Commander of the 2nd Battalion 410th Field Artillery, 177th Armored Brigade, Camp Shelby MS.
