

LTC Kenrick L. Herrmann was commissioned in the United States Army Reserves as an ordnance officer from the ROTC Program at Vanderbilt University on 10 May 1991. Herrmann graduated from the Tank & Automotive Ordnance Officer Basic Course at Aberdeen Proving Ground in 1991. Herrmann was initially assigned as the armament officer with the 3220th garrison support unit in West Palm Beach, Fla. He later transferred to the 841st engineer battalion headquartered in Miami in 1992. From 1992 to 2001, Herrmann held a wide array of positions within the battalion: engineer platoon leader, support platoon leader, S2, S4, and battalion maintenance officer. His career at the 841st engineer battalion culminated as the company commander for C company located in Perrine, Fla.

In 2002, Herrmann transferred to the 3220th garrison support unit in West Palm Beach. The unit was mobilized to Fort Stewart, Ga. in January 2003 in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom. There, he served as the as battle captain at the emergency operations center in support of the 3 ID rear detachment. After the 10 month mobilization, Herrmann served as the plans and operations officer at the 3220th.

In October 2008, he transferred to the 2145th GSU in Nashville, Tenn. The unit deployed to Iraq in support of OIF. Herrmann served as the mayor for Camp East Liberty located within the Victory Base Complex, Baghdad, Iraq. Upon return from Iraq, Herrmann transferred to the 604th engineer detachment in Orlando, Fla. to be the facilities engineer team leader. In April 2001, he to the 641st regional support group, St Petersburg, Fla. as the brigade executive officer. On 2 June 2012, Herrmann assumes command of the 1-349th logistics support battalion located in Fort Gordon, Ga.

His awards and decorations include the Meritorious Service Medal; Army Commendation Medal with 3 Oak Leaf Clusters; Joint Achievement Service Medal; Army Achievement Medal, the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal; National Defense Service Medal 2nd Award; Iraqi Campaign Medal; Armed Forces Reserve Medal with Hour Glass; Army Reserve Component Medal; and Army Service Ribbon. Herrmann graduated from the engineer Officer Advance Course, Combined Staff Services School, Mobilization & Deployment Course, Command General Staff College ILE; FEST-A Base Camp Development Course; and 90A Reserve Component Theater Sustainment Course. He holds a Bachelor of Science in Engineering and Political Science from Vanderbilt University.
