

FAQ

1. What type of equipment/gear do I need while I am at Fort Sam Houston for training?

-You will be in a classroom environment for most of the program, so pack your complete ACU's with patrol cap, and PT uniform with short sleeve shirt/shorts, camel back, personal medications, and profiles. Be advised as the months change to look at the weather channel to watch for extra snivel gear that you might want to bring to remain comfortable to the climate. You may also bring your lap top to take notes in class or download useful information. Computers are not furnished in this program.

2. When does the program start? I reported on a Monday at 0900 and was late?

-The MTT program classes start on the exact date that it is scheduled on your orders. (exception to government holidays). Your report date encourages you to show up and report a day ahead of the first day of class to become familiar with the drive, community, and recon where you are going to be. The class starts at 0730-0745 on the first day of class. It does not mean you show up at 1000 on the first day of class and say that you are reporting today.

3. What happens if I want to take leave between MTT class and reporting to Ft. Riley?

-All soldiers should report to MTT with a set of orders and a DA31 filled out that takes them all the way up to Fort Riley. Leave in the interim should have already been discussed with your losing unit and filled out. This program and personnel does NOT fill out leave, recommend leave or anything to do administratively with your leave or orders reporting to Fort Riley (Fort Polk as of August 2009).

4. Where do I stay when I get to Fort Sam Houston, TX for lodging?

- All soldiers have some type of authorization for lodging whether it is on or off post depends on the individual's orders. Soldiers in advance of reporting to the course should reserve their lodging. If you are authorized on post then you report to Army Guest Lodging (BAQ) and are given a room. If they do not have lodging a "Statement of Non-Availability" is generated and off post lodging is authorized.

If you are authorized off post lodging, you should still gain the form that states, non-availability from Army Guest Lodging (BAQ), or simply call 1-800-GOARMY1, they will give you a number that you attach to your orders when settling your voucher and they also recommend surrounding lodging for the soldier.

5. Can I bring my POV?

- The soldier's orders should state whether or not a POV is authorized!!

6. How long is class daily?

- Check the schedule, tentatively the class starts at 0800 to 1700 daily.

7. How many CEU's do I get for this course?

- As of right now the course is offering 61 CEU's

8. Can I schedule an appointment during classroom time?

- Appointments will be a case by case basis depending of the authorization of the NCOIC and OIC of the MTT program.

9. Where is classroom located?

-As of 1 June 2009 the classroom is located on WW White, Bldg 1374, room 350-351. The building is across from the pool, and one floor above the BNCOC medical tech phase for personnel that need a landmark.

10. When can I schedule flights at the earliest when the course is done?

- Flights can not depart any earlier than 1900 the last day of class

11. Do I need to bring any extra reading material or medical books to class?

- No all medical materials, books, cd, and handouts will be given to you during class. A back pack might be a good investment during this course.

12. Do I get weekends off?

-Weekends are off at this time, you are on student status, and an NCO and are expected to maintain your professionalism on and off post while in this program, regardless of the branch of service. All personnel that fall short of this are subject to UCMJ.
